Affiliate Notes:

Each affiliate exists solely for the benefit of the University and its students by supporting the mission and goals of the University, and to make financial contributions or to provide similar benefits to the University.

All three Student Associations, in cooperation with the University President, set and supervise the collection, retention and expenditure of the Student Activity Fee. Student Activity Fees are used to fund such things as student clubs and organizations. Each affiliate performs similar services in support of the University; however, their funding sources (outside of student fees) vary and results in different levels of financial support to the University (other funding sources can consist of bookstore contract revenue, commencement contract related revenues, etc.)

- **Student Association, Inc. (California):** The MOU outlines that SAI funding to the University consists of activities such as athletic funding, proceeds from commencement photography and class rings, and proceeds from broadcast media licenses. The Student Association oversees the operation of Vulcan Village.
- **Clarion Students' Association:** The MOU outlines that funding to the University consists of scholarships, awards, and grants to support individual students, student athletics, and student group recognition.

- **Edinboro University Student Government Association, Inc.:** The MOU outlines that funding to the University consists of funding requests and recommendations from the University president, and regular allocations of available unrestricted funds to support University programs and Institutional Advancement efforts.

The **foundations** were formed to support the charitable, scientific, and educational purposes of the University. They participate in joint fundraising, capital campaigns, alumni and advancement services, grant and program management, repository for donations, and fiscal management.

- **Foundation for California University of Pennsylvania:** The MOU outlines that funding to the University consists of gifts, scholarships, and program/grant-related funds.
- **Clarion University Foundation, Inc.:** The MOU outlines that funding to the University consists of gifts, grants, scholarships, and other program related funds. The Foundation and University have a capital lease in place for University housing. The Foundation also maintains the alumni/donor database and other advancement software platforms.
- **Edinboro University Foundation:** The MOU outlines that funding to the University consists of gifts, scholarships, programs, and special events. Historically, Edinboro received scholarship gifts directly to the University and recorded on the University side resulting in the variance with other campuses.
- **Edinboro Alumni Association:** This is the only alumni association that is an independent nonprofit corporation and recognized as an affiliate. They also own the alumni house. The MOU outlines that funding consists of gifts and grants.

The University provides support to an affiliate in the form of space on campus, which may include utilities, custodial, maintenance, and groundskeeping services. The value is based upon square footage and associated charges. These values are reflected on the statement of external support. The Edinboro Alumni Association and Foundation offices are housed in a building owned by the Alumni Association; therefore, a zero value is reflected. For the Clarion University Foundation, Inc., as outlined in their MOU, the University provided \$340,000 for advancement support, raising awareness, and building a deep network of funding partners for the University, and maintaining the donor database.
