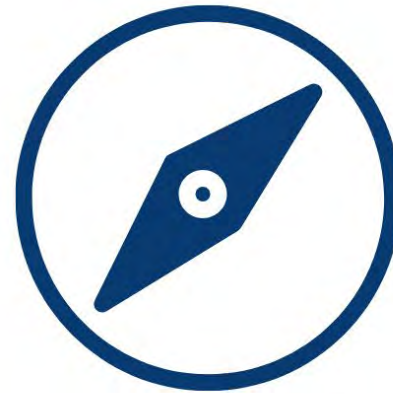

Estimated Financial Aid Offer



- At the end of January, *Estimated Financial Aid Offers* started to be emailed out and will continue to be sent weekly.
- The email is sent to both the student's personal email on file and his/her PennWest email accounts.
- The email will come from *financialaid@pennwest.edu* and will include a link to access the offer.
- The information on your offer is only accurate as of the date listed on the top right corner.

Financial Aid Terminology

Federal Pell Grant – Federal grant that is need-based and does not have to be repaid

Federal SEOG – Federal grant that is offered to students with the most financial need and does not have to be repaid

PA State Grant – Pennsylvania state grant that is need-based and does not have to be repaid

Federal Direct Subsidized Loans – A loan for students with financial need. You won't be charged interest while you are enrolled in school as long as you remain at least half time.

Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loans – Interest starts accumulating from the date of your first loan disbursement (when you receive the funds from your school.)

Costs Payable to the School – Expenses you will find on a university invoice such as tuition and fees, and room and meals if you are living on campus.

Costs Paid to Others – Expenses you won't find on a university invoice such as books and supplies, transportation costs, and miscellaneous/personal expenses.

Cost of Attendance (COA) – Total cost for a student to attend a specific school. The COA includes both costs payable to the school and costs paid to others.

 - Create an FSA ID for both parent and student 3 days prior to starting your FAFSA.
- PHEAA's deadline this year is May 1, 2025.

- Apply for PennWest Scholarships.
- Apply for External Scholarships.

MEAL PLAN BASICS

Meals in a weekly plan (19, 14, and 10) reset every Monday, while meals in a block plan (75 and 40) carry over from week to week for the duration of the semester.

Meal transactions using a Meal Swipe, Meal Exchange, or Meal Equivalency can be used every 15 minutes. All meal plans come with five guest meals for students to use in Eagle Commons on friends, family, or themselves.

Meal Exchanges may be used on select menu items at The Barista and Ghost Kitchen.

A meal equivalency of \$7.40 may be used on all items at any dining location. Additional order balances can be paid with Dine or Shop Dollars, Cash or Credit.

Dine Dollars can be used to make purchases at all campus dining locations and vending machines.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I change my meal plan?

Yes – Students are able to submit meal plan changes (or cancellations for commuter students) through their my.pennwest portal until the first Friday of the semester. Please note that changes and cancellations submitted after the meal plans have become active for the semester are subject to additional fees.

What happens to unused Dine Dollars?

Any Dine Dollars remaining in your account at the end of the fall semester will carry over into the spring semester. However, any Dine Dollars remaining at the end of the spring semester cannot be transferred and are non-refundable.

What if I have dietary restrictions?

Our dining program can accommodate medical dietary requirements and assist you in choosing wisely if allergies are a concern. For additional information or questions, email our Resident Director at spenniman@pennwest.edu.

MOBILE ORDERING

Campus dining is now even easier with mobile ordering. Simply follow the steps below –

Step 1: Download the *GrubHub* app through the App Store or Google Play.

Step 2: Select *Account*, then *Campus Dining*, then search and select *PennWest*.

Step 3: Select *Add Your Card*.

Step 4: Log in with your PennWest credentials.

Step 5: Place your order.

Step 6: Pick up your order at the Ghost Kitchen window.

BLOCK PLANS

In addition to the meal plans listed above, Commuter students and students living off-campus who wish to have a meal plan may select from one of the following block plans that allot three meals per day

75 Block Plan - \$795
75 meals per semester
\$125 dine dollars

40 Block Plan - \$495
40 meals per semester
\$125 dine dollars

WAYS TO PURCHASE FOOD

Meal Exchanges are meals that are included in a meal swipe that do not require an additional balance to be paid during check out. Locations with meal exchange options have designated meal exchange menus that rotate periodically.

Meal Equivalency is a cash equivalency of \$7.40 that can be used towards the balance of your meal transaction at all retail locations.

Dine Dollars can be used to make food and beverage purchases at all dining and vending locations on campus. Dine Dollars remaining in your account at the end of the fall semester will carry over into the spring semester provided that you continue on a meal plan. However, any balance remaining at the end of the spring semester will not roll over and is non-refundable.

Meals in a Residential Meal Plan reset every Monday, while meals in a Block Plan carry over from week to week throughout the duration of the semester.

All meal plans come with five guest meals for use in Eagle Commons dining hall.

Meal Plans transactions can be used in 15-minute intervals.

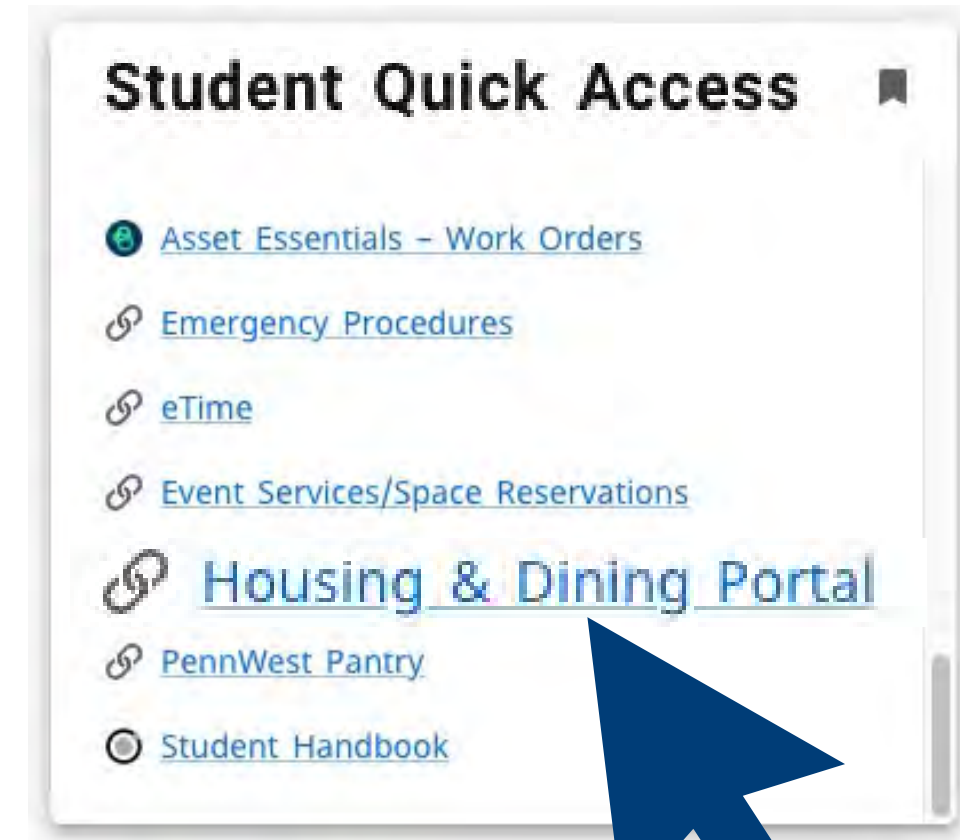
